MAY 21 OPEN FULL MOON

LOOKING AT ESOTERIC DIAGRAMS

Leafing through various occult books or searching the internet, a student can find a diagram for almost any set of symbols and energies imaginable. Look hard enough and you can eventually find a second diagram that says that the first diagram that you found is completely wrong. And well before that point, you will have found an essay claiming such. Why are there so many esoteric diagrams? And why do some experts insist that some diagrams and explanations are wrong?

The first question is easily answered. Quite simply, there are some things that are best explained through the use of diagrams. If you are a visual learner, and we all are to a certain extent, a picture is worth a thousand words. Sometimes it is easier to explain relationships between symbols, points of energy, with the use of a diagram than to do it using a wordy description.

My proof of this---astrology. Imagine trying to do astrology without the use of a chart. It is a fair bet that if you practice astrology, and I mention that I am Virgo with a Cancer rising sign with my Mercury in Leo and Moon in Scorpio, that you ended up with a simplified picture of my natal chart in the back of your mind. To really understand me using astrology, you need the full birth chart.

If I need more examples, then I can invoke the Wheel of the year, the Kabbalistic Tree of Life, and the Tarot. Each of these has at least one diagram associated with the energies that are being used. The diagrams explain the relationships between the energies.

It is the second question that is harder to answer. Why do the experts insist that certain diagrams are wrong? Sometimes it is because the person simply does not understand the energies and relationships that a diagram describes while firmly believing that they do. Other times it is because they are using a different set of keys to understand the diagram. Differences in opinion are the result of understanding the diagrams differently.

One of the advantages of being an initiate is that (in theory) you were given the keys to understand the diagrams that your tradition uses during course of your initiations and their related support material. Unfortunately, it is impossible to come to a complete consensus among the experts because different traditions use different key sets. Also, some experts were never given keys to certain diagrams in the first place.

A diagram can look wrong or completely meaningless if you do not have the keys to unlock it. One has to look at a diagram from the right direction to see what it is really saying. The most perfect diagram describing the ultimate secret of the universe will look completely meaningless if you do not know any of the symbols associated with it.

A large part of the time that an esoteric student spends will involve symbols, their energies, diagrams, and explanations of them. A lucky student will be handed the proper keys in a timely manner; the unlucky student will be

left drifting at sea without a compass to guide them.
