Brainwashed Language Monkeys (or, Your Puny Law of Karma Does Not Apply to Me)

As most of my friends know, I spend way too much time on the internet reading the stupid. I seem to enjoy it tremendously. And that is because I am fascinated by the train wreck that we call humanity. After all, what other species is there that believes that half of its population is completely and utterly wrong?

Yesterday, I was on Facebook reading my newsfeed, when I stumbled across a real gem of disagreement. Someone, who I will refer to as Joe the Magician, posted a gripe as his status update. And I can't do it justice without presenting it in its full over-the-top glory.

Joe the Magician wrote: "Today, I have seen a few arrogant wannabes with superiority complexes, looking down on people like Gods and judging them [as if] they were nothing more than cattle, or 'brainwashed language monkeys' as one of them so eloquently stated. If these people are so intelligent and so all-knowing, I wonder why they are too stupid to learn about Karma, or the Law of Attraction, or the Principle of Cause and Effect, because these universal laws apply to everyone, no matter how smart a person may think they are. I guess that they are using the little bit of intelligence that they have to appear to be more than they really are. Perhaps, they are also trying to cover up their own fears and insecurities by attacking others."

Toss in the Three-fold Law and the Wiccan Rede, and you would have the Unholy Pentefecta of Pagan Morals and Ethics, that set of cosmic rules that the fluffier pagans and Wiccans like to beat people over the head with when people decide to do things that the fluffies hate, such as cursing an enemy.

And let's be honest, while I did not call anyone a brainwashed language monkey (and you all know that I wish that I came up with that term, for it perfectly describes some of the more stubborn specimens of humanity), I am definitely one of those people who have not learned the joys of the Unholy Pentefecta.

For instance, Karma is completely misused by most modern Westerners. In its original context, in the Hindu religion of India, Karma means the principle by which the state of one's next life is determined. It should also be noted that I do still teach a "chickens coming home to roost" principle, but that I use another term for it, being the Old Norse word, Wyrd.)

Each of the other parts of the Unholy Pentefecta of Pagan Morals and Ethics is also misunderstood by the majority of the people who haul them out in judgment of other people. The "laws" are used by the fluffies to judge, and put in their proper place, those who the fluffies feel are not being good representatives of the pagan community. And often those being judged are actually more educated in paganism and occultism than the people judging them.

I find it sad that those who understand the principles of magic the least (probably having never worked a successful operation in their entire life), have gotten it into their heads that they understand the laws of magic better than those who have spent decades studying and actually working the system. Yes, I realize that I should respect the beliefs of those people who are better human beings than I am...but I do not think that the fluffies are my superiors. There is also the little fact that if the Unholy Pentefecta worked the way that the fluffies think they do, my life would be a smoking crater. Someone must be wrong, and I do not think that it is me. So I must be one of these arrogant judgmental wannabes that Joe the Magician thinks that he is better than—is it wrong that I take some pride in that?

WAITING FOR AUTUMN.

Autumn is almost here. I can't wait for autumn to arrive. I usually view autumn with excitement, until I realize we're that much closer to winter, but as with all things, you have to take the good with the bad. This year, I'm not dreading the change in weather so much. Many of the clients I work with do not have Central Air or any air conditioning at all, and the schools are still sweltering.

In anticipation of cooler weather, I'm going to share two of my favorite simmering potpourri recipes.

Obviously, you'll need a small pot, and some water. Always keep the burner on simmer and don't forget to keep an eye on it. I've ruined a pot before due to letting all the water boil off.

Fill a small pot with water about 3/4 of the way full. Add 2 cinnamon sticks (or you can use a tablespoon of cinnamon...more or less depending on preference and amount of water being used. The same goes for the rest of the ingredients.) A teaspoon each of Nutmeg, cloves (whole or ground are fine), allspice and a splash of vanilla.

A simpler recipe would be to add a cinnamon stick, and orange and lemon rinds to water and simmer.

Sometimes I'm lazy and I just throw in an apple core and a teaspoon of apple pie spice (they actually have a blend at Target).

These always make me feel like autumn is coming when I brew them and it's easier for me to get into the spirit of the season, especially when we're mid-September and are still having 90 degree days. I'm definitely ready for the season to change and the weather to get cooler. Here's hoping that this year, we have a magnificent autumn!
