#### **AUGUST 24, 2018 OPEN FULL MOON**

Hearthstone meets the Friday before or the Friday of the Full Moon in the Library Room at the Althea Center for Engaged Spirituality, 1400 Williams St., Denver, CO. There are two small parking lots, to the north (next to the building) and east of the building (across the alley), each with spaces for 20 cars. Enter through the Main Door at the corner of Williams St. and 14<sup>th</sup> Ave. The door opens at 7:00 pm, and we must lock the door at 7:30 to secure the building. Please be prompt as we don't want you to be locked out! This month's ritual is Friday, August 24, 2018.

Hawk Shadow invites you to join her for a ritual to embrace delight – your own delight. The rite will be of an essentially traditional Wiccan structure. You will be asked to participate, which will involve coming to the altar and saying something aloud – something that you will find in yourself during the ritual.

## **FULLY PRESENT**

Dragonfest 2018 was amazing. I'm still posting pictures of the native plants we identified in a multigenerational walk around the sacred land, and still enjoying the benefits of participating in community.

It was the first time for me to teach and share on the practice of walking meditation which blends so beautifully with my Druidic practices of knowing the sacred landscape and living in awareness of the seasons and lunar cycles.

I do a Buddhist-like, ten-minute, circumambulation (walking silently in a circle with even, deliberate pacing) at 7 am on the morning after the new moon, the day when the moon rises with the sun and will be in the sky (nearly invisible) all day at the beginning of the lunar month. The Irish phrase that means the moon is new, translates literally as "Life is changing there." Tá athrú ré ann. The practice of a simple, contemplative walk, on the first morning that the moon rises with the sun after the New Moon, signals a change to the soul, a welcoming of the possibilities of the month ahead.

I joked in Dragonfest morning announcements that the mediation is only ten minutes because I'm a Celt, not a Buddhist, but, in fact, the latest research shows that as little as 10 minutes can have a positive effect on the brain and the body.

We spent a lot of time singing and sharing stories and poems at Dragonfest. It filled my heart! Our full moon ceremony has always had space for poems and song, and I'm thrilled that these last few months people have shared even more. Moon after moon we have sung together and listened to heartfelt recitation. All around us the trees listened, the sky listened, our ancestors heard our voices. This path is a bardic path, words matter, music is magic. We will sing our way out of the summer and through the harvests of the Fall.

And what a difference it makes to be able to recognize and name the bounty of our sacred space! Irish tales are full of such specific plant and tree references that it inspired me to earn my CSU extension Native Plant Master Certification. An old Irish saying (seanfhocail) says: A nettle burns (stings) me. Dock will cure me. (Neantóg a dhóigh mé, copóg a leigheas mé.) For every ill there is a cure in the land. Together seventeen of us took time to recognize Colorado River birch, birch being the first in the tree ogham, as well as yarrow, raspberry, strawberries, chokecherries, gooseberries, currants, wild geranium, kinnickkinnick, wild rose, vanilla-scented ponderosa pine, and so much more. Each of these has a story and a place, a use, and a history. It was wonderful to share. Being able to identify the individual plants is like finally recognizing friends in a crowded party, the whole landscape feels different. The story that it tells deepens with understanding.

Although the season for Celtic Plant Walks has ended, I'll do it again next year, and I will always be talking about how to be a little safer and more confident on day hikes in our environment, I've got it built into my workshops! We have so much wonder right at hand and a Druid's place is out in it!

More teaching makes better teaching. I am partnering, again, with Spiritways Metaphysical to offer four workshops on this Irish Polytheistic Path. I am continually tweaking the material as I learn and grow. Now there is more storytelling and I'm adding some additional practical information so that people can more readily engage with the material when the workshop is over.

Is maith an scéalaí an aimsir.

Time is a good storyteller.

# Should we perform ritual with those who are under the influence of drugs or alcohol?

As pagans, there are certain times that ceremonial drinking or imbibing of other substances is not unheard of. However, this is usually done with extreme care and specific intent. The people that I know who have done so, have done it in a way that doesn't interfere with the rest of the group or the energy and intention of the ritual. That's because they've done this before in their own private work and haven't taken anything that they weren't used to prior to doing in rituals many times before. In other words, it didn't affect their functioning or the energies surrounding the ritual. Not being able to control the energy if one is not able to function just wastes the time of the others involved. The energy may also affect others in the group negatively unbeknownst to that individual. I've experienced vertigo and headaches due to this.

I've thought about this topic a lot in recent weeks because I have had the unfortunate experiences in the past of doing ritual with someone who arrived to group extremely drunk, high, or hungover. I doubt this was the first occasion that these folks had shown up under the influence, but I digress. I find it interesting to note that most of the offenders that I know of have been male. I'm not sure why this is.

There have been a few occasions (in different groups) where we had to accommodate some need of the person who was under the influence. During one ritual, we had to speak very softly because the person in question had a headache. During another ritual one of the individuals became hostile. I regret not saying anything openly those times because I felt like I was in the minority thinking that these high, drunk, or hungover people probably shouldn't have actively performed in ritual. My question to this day is why we enabled this behavior. It only led to the discussion of said person's behavior at a later date and made it way more uncomfortable than it had to be. Since I've not been a group leader, I'm not sure why this behavior was tolerated initially. I understand if there was a doubt but if it seems counter-intuitive to allow it especially after a pattern has been established. I get it. No one likes to be the bad guy. But this has happened in several groups that I have been involved with. It seems ridiculous to me, but maybe this behavior is what our community deems normal. It may be that paganism as a whole has a stigma of being a partying religious path and we should accept this. But if this is the case, then I might have to rethink my involvement in any group.

It is understandable that sometimes younger people experiment with ritual. It's part of learning the path. If someone is younger and new to the craft, then it goes without saying that they might make the mistake of imbibing too much prior or during a ritual, especially if they are solitary. Let me be clear. I've had many experiences with older folks who have questionable drinking habits that find their way into ritual. It's not enough to say they need to do so in moderation. Most likely these types of folks have issues of control regarding how much substances they ingest. Still, the fact is that I have

not ever experienced an effective ritual when there was someone who was significantly under the influence of a substance.

That being said, I wouldn't even blink an eye if someone who, as part of a ritual, imbibed some spirits as part of the ritual. These types of things are planned and are usually done responsibly. If done right, it shouldn't alter the energy level in the room or affect others in a negative way. However, when doing ritual and the person is inebriated or hung over, I've noticed that there was not enough power to raise any palpable energy.

A good example using alcohol in ritual properly, was when, many years ago, I lost a sibling. Ironically, they passed a few days before Samhain. I was over a friend's house a several days later when they noticed I was not right. We ended up having an impromptu blot. We imbibed a little as I spoke about my sibling. It absolutely made me feel much better...and I wasn't wasted afterwards. The healing energy that was raised was enough to get me through the funeral which was being held on the other side of the country. Moderation is key and we shouldn't be afraid to ask someone to sit out of the ritual if they appear extremely impaired, especially if they have a history of doing so.
